

Additionally, the group is testing multiple methods for communicating about genetic testing and infectious diseases (e.g., the Zika virus, Ebola, influenza).

**The Blaschke lab** research interests include, the development of rapid diagnostic testing to improve the management of bacterial and viral infections in children, including the rapid identification of antibiotic-resistant pathogens and pathogens causing pneumonia. In addition, the lab studies invasive bacterial pathogens using comparative genomics to understand genetic factors leading to specific disease manifestations.






